WHAT'S YOUR ZONE?

TRA's programs and services grow monthly. When volunteers can't fill all ride requests, TRA has three backup options. New York State Office for the Aging Releases Results of First Statewide Survey of Older Adults

NYSOFA recently released county-by-county data from their Community Assessment Survey of Older Adults. The statewide survey for adults age 60 + received nearly 27,000 responses.

There were mixed results on ease of transportation but 45% of Westchester residents and 47% of Putnam residents identified having safe and affordable transportation available as problematic. 13% of Putnam and 18% of Westchester respondents reported they were no longer able to drive.
